During the 2020 World War II 75th anniversary year, on December 7, 2020 the Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum is launching a Rosie the Riveter Heritage Trail honoring the women of the 1940's who served doing men's jobs on the homefront.

The Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum is inviting stories of 1940's women who were riveters, welders, crane operators, drivers and the many other work roles that kept the homefront industries in motion when the men went to the warfront. Stories of these women from all 50 states are welcomed. For a donation to the Museum of \$19.41 your honoree's story and photo will be displayed on the Museum's website within the Heritage Trail. Your Rosie or you as submitter if Rosie is deceased, will receive a certificate acknowledging her World War II contribution on the homefront. Why the amount of \$19.41? It serves as a reminder of the first year Mr. Martin hired women to work on his aircraft manufacturing assembly line in support of World War II and being on the front line of recruiting women to do a man's job, thus initiating a "We Can Do It!" movement across the country.
